Legislative Update:

■ Ken Spiker, our legislative chairman and elected retiree member of the LACERS Board of Directors, reports he is very upset over the contract bank not getting last month's retirement checks out on time. Ken said many retirees need the check to be deposited on the specified date to be sure their rent and other important checks they write do not bounce. He has asked staff to make a thorough investigation of why the checks were late. Since this is the second time in three years this has happened, Ken plans to ask the Board of Directors to change

banks if the bank now under contract does not guarantee this will not happen

■ Ken also reports he has petitioned the Executive Employee Relations Committee to discuss additional benefits for our retirees. Ken would like the opportunity to inform the committee of the need to improve current benefits, especially for those members who are not receiving social security and rely solely on a small City pension.

annually in continuing education provided by the Society. The CSA membership will ensure that she remains an informed profes-


