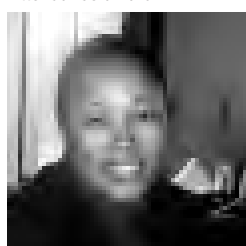

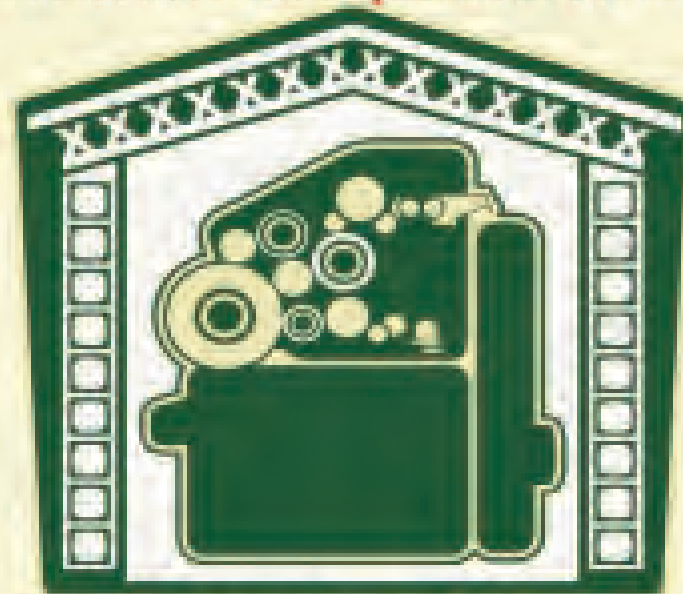
Haven House is the oldest shelter of its kind in the United States, founded in 1964 to shelter families of violent alcoholics.
