Brave members of the team from the LAPD took off from Baker April 23 heading toward Vegas as part of the 21st annual Baker to Vegas Challenge Cup Relay Race.

The race has become the largest law enforcement athletic event of its kind in the world, organizers say. Participation includes 10,000 law enforcement officers, chiefs of police, agents-in-charge, sheriffs, department heads, the FBI, the Secret Service, DEA, military police, celebrities, dignitaries, family members, race sponsors, press and media.

The race attracts more than 220 teams representing law enforcement and judicial systems from throughout the United States and around the world. Teams who have participated in the race have traveled from as far as Great Britain. Germany, Australia and Canada.










