Firehouse Going Up

■ Ground is broken for new fire station in San Pedro.

FIRE DEPT. — The LAFD broke ground May 2 on Fire Station 36 on N. Gaffey Street in San Pedro, to be constructed under Proposition F funds.

This area has not had a fire station since July 1, 1972. That fire station is still standing but now serves the City of San Pedro as a historical museum. The resources at Fire Station 85 and Fire Station 112 currently cover the area. However, due to the distance the firefighters need to travel, current emergency response times in this area

are substantially above the Fire Department Citywide goal of five minutes at least 90 per cent of the time, according to officials.

The service district population for San Pedro is projected to increase by 22.3 percent to nearly 90,000 residents by 2010. Resource workloads for this station are projected to increase by more than 12 percent in the same period. The district that the new Fire/ Paramedic station will cover is predominantly residential, with oil refineries and harbor waterfront.

Fire Station 36 will house a single Engine Company, a Rescue Ambulance and a medical Captain for a total staff of four firefighters and three paramedics.
