LIBRARY — Hundreds of schoolchildren and

The branch is at 24000 S. Western Ave.

The ceremony included students from local schools, City Librarian Fontayne Holmes, Councilwoman Janice Hahn, Library Commission President Robert Chick and State Librarian Susan Hildreth.

The new 14,650-squarefoot, state-of-the-art branch features special areas for children, teens and adults, a mul-

tipurpose meeting room, and two study rooms. It also provides 50 computers with access to the Internet and the library's full range of electronic resources. Also provided is a Computer Training Center for joint use with Narbonne High School.

Harbor Gateway–Harbor City Library was the only library in leased storefront space in the City, and it was way too small. The new library is big; it is state of the art; and its location is in the perfect space to share with Narbonne High School. This is exactly what this community deserves."

The branch was formerly located in leased space. Construction of the new purpose-built library building was funded by savings from Proposition DD, the 1998 City of Los Angeles library bond that built 32 branch libraries on time and under budget, as well as funds from Proposition 14, the State Library Bond Act of 2000.


