"This is the Kodak Tower in Rochester, N.Y. It's 360 feet with 19 floors.

This building has been called the 'nerve center of photography,' housing the administrative offices of the Eastman Kodak organization. It was designed in a modified French Renaissance style, constructed with a steel skeleton faced with terra cotta. The mansard roof and aluminum tower, built in 1930, rises 106 feet above the 19th floor."


Mexico
