## Pet Adopt-a-Thon

Animal Services held its Spay Day LA Adopt-a-Thon Oct. 25 at all six Animal Services shelters.

The event was a huge success. More than 500 animals from every part of the City were spayed or neutered. The public/private-sponsored event was in celebration and support of the City's landmark spay/neuter law that came into force Oct. 1.

LA Animal Services also held a pet Adopt-a-Thon at all six City Animal Care Centers, offering more than a 60 percent savings off regular adoption fees, which included spay/neuter surgery, microchip, vaccinations, and in the case of dogs, a license. The adoption fee for a dog was \$43, \$28 for a cat, and \$25 for a rabbit. More than 250 pets were adopted (total) from the six shelters.

Ed Boks, General Manager, Animal Services, thanked the local private veterinarians, the Amanda Foundation, the Sam Simon Foundation, the Clinico Foundation, the Fix Nation Foundation; and employees and volunteers for making this event happen.
