

Everyday Distribution Distribut A 130-acre brush fire broke out July 5 in the Little Tujunga Canyon section of Angeles National Forest. The fire started around 1:45 p.m. near 13000 Little Tujunga Canyon Rd., near where the Marek Fire started last year. Three helicopters, two air tankers and about 250 firefighters, including City and county personnel, as well as U.S. Forest Service

firefighters, had the blaze 60 percent contained as of 6 p.m. One firefighter suffered a minor injury, it was reported. No evacuations were ordered and no structures were threatened. Reports from the scene indicated moderate winds in the area and medium to heavy brush.
