# Baker to Vegas:

## A (Hot) Race for the Glory

 $\Gamma$  or stamina, dedication and physical fitness, there's nothing like the annual Baker to Vegas Challenge Cup Relay. And that time came again to the desert

This amazing foot race is an annual event for public safety organizations throughout the world. The relay race is a 120-mile, 20-stage foot race between Baker, Calif., and Las Vegas and is considered the "Super Bowl" of law enforcement and the champions are the best, in terms of physical fitness and logistics the police world has to offer. The race was created by and is managed by the Los Angeles Police Rotary and Athletic Club, and the City Employees Club is grateful for their leadership.

This year was the Club's eighth covering this amazing event. The Club sponsored five teams (teams 116, 140, 153, 168 and 271): the Port Police, LAPD Emergency Services Division (Bomb, K9

and Force Investigation Division) and Transportation, which again joined forces with General Services Office of Public Safety. Two new teams sponsored by the Club were the Airport Police (LAX) and LAPD Jail Division.

"Each year the race grows, and with 270 teams from the law enforcement community around the world, this year's race proved to be the biggest Challenge Cup Relay ever," according to race coordinator Chuck Foote. By noon, the temperature rose to more than 107 degrees, with the asphalt temperature reaching more than 130 degrees.

Airport Police entered in the "mixed" category, with a team consisting of five women and 15 men. This is the first year Airport Police Security Officers participated, placing ninth out of 50 teams in their category and finishing in 17 hours, 1 minute and 57 seconds, incurring no penalties. For their first time in seven

years of entering, they were able to bring home a mug, a kind of race trophy. Overall the team placed 81st out of 270 teams. "I am exceptionally proud of the teamwork, persistence and determination demonstrated by the members of our organization in achieving success in this race under very adverse conditions," said Airport Police Chief Michael Hyams.

Overall, four teams sponsored by the Club came home with a mug. Congratulations to all the teams, including the four teams that mugged (Airport Police, Jail Division, Transportation/ General Services, and Port Police). "One of our runners suffered heat exhaustion, [which] brought our race journey to an end. But we will return next year stronger and more determined than ever," said Officer John Long from the LAPD Emergency Services team.



#### **Overall Winners:**

The LAPD Team took first place in the Open Category, finishing the race in 13 hours 7 minutes 33 seconds, knocking last year's winner, the Los Angeles Sheriff's Dept. Countywide team. It truly was an LAPD year, as LAPD Women's Team also took first place in the women's category.




