View the Transit of Venus

The transit of Venus occurs when the planet Venus passes directly between the earth and the sun. During the transit, Venus will appear as a small black dot on the face of the sun.

The next transit of Venus won't occur for another 105 years! No transit of Venus has been visible from Los Angeles since Dec. 6, 1882.

No one should ever look directly at the sun or Venus in the daytime without proper protection. The telescopes available for free viewing of the transit at the Griffith Observatory will be equipped with proper filters.

Here in Los Angeles, Venus will first cross in front of the sun's disc at 3:06 p.m. and will continue to move across the disk.
