Vintage Pottery Day

Banning Museum to host lecture, samples of Ohio pottery.

Fans of Antiques Road Show, take note: Ohio Valley pottery from 1890 to 1925 is the subject of a lecture scheduled for 10 a.m. Jan. 19 at the Banning Museum in Wilmington.

Highlights of the lecture will cover collecting 300 pieces of original Ohio Valley pottery from 1890 to 1925. Guests will be able to examine samples of this private collection, which includes pieces of Rookwood, Roseville, Weller and Owens pottery. There will be a question-and-answer session after the lecture. Guests will also be invited to view the Museum's "The Art That Is Life" exhibit showcas-

ing exquisite pieces from Ohio manufacturers. Light refreshments will be served.

The lecture coincides with an ongoing exhibit displaying a collection of American art pottery and showcasing exquisite pieces from Ohio manufacturers. These pieces were produced during the end of the Victorian era through the Arts and Crafts movement, 1890-1925.

During the turn of the 20th century, many home furnishings still adhered

to the Victorian aesthetic of deep colors and decadent designs. But the craftsman movement called for the revival of traditional artistry techniques in response to the growing production of these wares by machine. This craftsmanship revival can be seen in the pottery industry, where pieces were prized for their artistry and individuality. The Ohio area proved a lucrative location for prospective potteries due to the plentiful clay deposits. In One of several American art pottery response to the growing demand samples on display at the Banning for art pottery, the Roseville, Rookwood, Weller and Owens

companies used raw materials to create some of the pieces that exemplify the American Arts and Crafts Movement.




