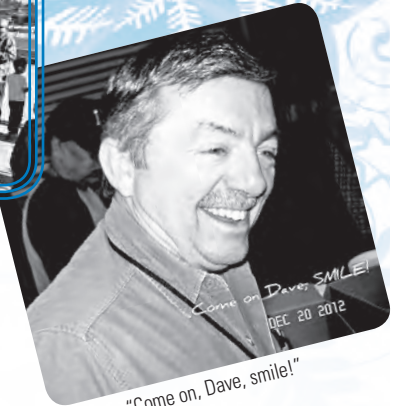

The main event is always the season's holiday potluck lunch, where

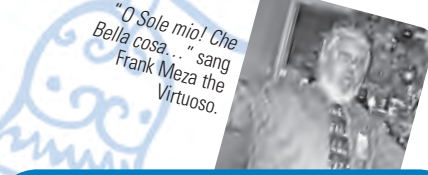

## Street Lighting

Public Works/Street Lighting collected more than 700 toys for Lockwood Elementary School, delivering them on Dec. 6. The delivery event continued a 15-year tradition with Lockwood Elementary. It started when the Field Operations Division, headed by the Division Manager, adopted the school due to its desire to give back to the community and the proximity to its office on Santa Monica Boulevard in the Virgil Village area. The relationship with Lockwood elementary grew stronger when staff found out it was one of the lowest-ranking schools, as far as poverty levels, in the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD). With this knowledge, the staff at Field Operations Division began an annual collection of canned foods and money within the Bureau that was delivered to the school in early December for distribution to those in need during the holidays.

For the past three years, the Field Operations Division decided to change the dynamics and initiated a toy drive, ensuring that all children at the school would receive a gift during Christmas. For six weeks, employees in Street Lighting donated toys and money. This year, more than 700 unwrapped toys, separated by gender, were delivered to Lockwood Elementary. The goal was to make sure that every child received a gift. The mission was successful.

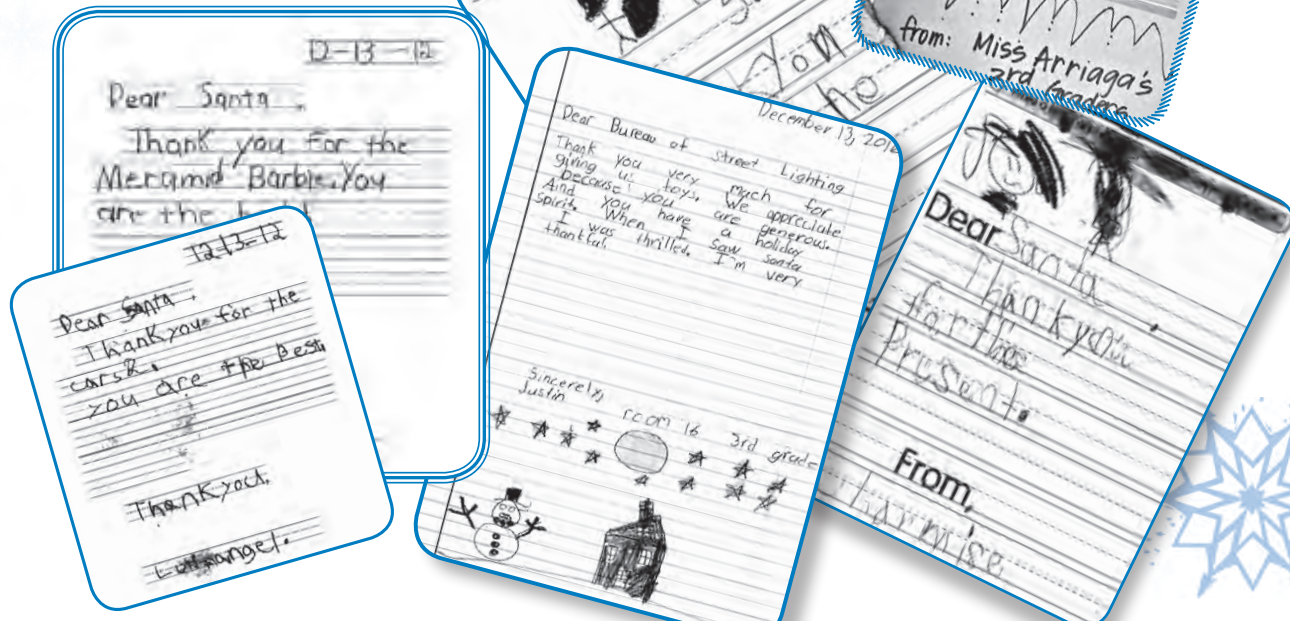
Last month, with tears in her eyes, school Principal Ruth Hawanaka gave Chris Mosman, Field Operations Division Manager, a stack

full of folders filled with thank-you letters. The children from grades K-5 wrote letters that would melt anyone's heart. One letter from a third-grader said it was her most favorite toy.
