# Cleaning the Dunes

m ore}$  than 100 volunteers joined with Airports personnel July 13 to remove invasive vegetation from coastal dunes in Playa del Rey.

The work was undertaken in preparation for a large-scale restoration effort scheduled this fall for the LAX Dunes Preserve area just north of Sandpiper Street between the west side of LAX and the beach. Because it is the nesting season, the volunteers focused only on removing ground cover plants including ice plants.

Called the Coastal Dunes Improvement Project, this is the first major restoration effort to be undertaken in this 48-acre area since it was rezoned for nature preserve uses in 1994 by the City. It is also one of many examples of Airports' integration of environmental sustainability values into LAX operations. Restoration of the LAX Dunes is part of Airports' overall effort to achieve sustainability at LAX.

The project also fulfilled a desire by the community to be involved with beautifying the site, restoring native habitat, and correcting human actions that have degraded this coastal dunes ecosystem.

All major restoration in the 307-acre coastal dunes area is overseen by Airports' Environmental Services Division and the California Coastal Commission. Airports also coordinates with other governmental agencies and the public to guide restoration activities.
