

Carbon Canyon Regional Park 4442 Carbon Canyon Road

Brea, CA 92823

Features: Redwood grove hike; 124-acre regional park; Carbon Canyon dam; playgrounds, barbecue and picnic areas; volleyball courts, bike trails,

equestrian trails, fishing and a nature center

Hours: Fall - winter, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Spring - summer, 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Parking: \$3 weekdays, \$5 weekends

Directions: From downtown, take the US-101 south and connect to the CA-60 east, then take the CA-57 south until you exit on East Lambert Road. Continue on East Lambert Road to CA-142 east/ Carbon Canyon Road. The destination will be on the right.

but that is because they are babies right now. The tallest redwoods are from 80 to 100 feet tall, and they were planted around 1975 when the park opened. The story is: A bank was having a promotion (for every account opened the bank would donate a tree), so when the promotion ended they had more than 600 seedlings left. Approximately 200 trees were donated to the county park after the bank promotion. This is a simple version of what happened.

Everything about this park is beautiful. So if you are ever in the Brea area, please stop by and enjoy the park and all there is to see. We recommend spending time in this park for a few hours or a full day. There is plenty of space and lots of activities for everyone. Lastly, if you have a dog or a few, you are welcome to bring them.
