Meiji Shrine: Vacation Edition



Yoyogi Park sprawls out over nearly 175 acres and is one of the largest parks in Tokyo, Japan. It houses the Meiji Memorial Picture Gallery, the National Stadium, the Meiji Memorial Hall which is now used for Shinto Weddings and the Meiji Shrine. I paid this park a visit recently but my day was spent almost entirely at the Shrine.

Construction began on the shrine in 1915 and was finished in 1926. It was dedicated to the Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken. The area is covered with nearly 365 different species of trees which were donated from all parts of Japan when the shrine was established. The original building was destroyed in WWII and what you see now was completed in 1958 through a public fund raising effort.

Passing through the first great Torii gate takes you a leisurely walk on a wide path, through the next Torii gate and on to the shrine complex. We were lucky enough to have a guide on hand to explain what we were seeing, offering up tidbits on history, the finer points of Shinto religion and the general care of this historic property.

It was a calm, wonderful experience and if you are ever in Tokyo, take the train to Harajuku Station to visit this lovely space.

sive nationwide recruitment that attracted more than a dozen candidates. Gannon has been performing the duties on an interim basis since January.

In a memo to staff, Airports Executive Director Gina Marie Lindsey wrote:

"His stellar performance in the aftermath of the November 1 incident has helped him to stand out as a candidate and a superb leader. As Deputy Executive Director, Homeland

Security and Law Enforcement, Gannon will provide leadership, management oversight and policy direction to all law enforcement and security staff at LAWA's three airports, coordinate with other Law Enforcement Agencies, be responsible for counterterrorism efforts and oversee firefighting, emergency medical, and fire prevention services provided by the LAFD at LAX. He has taken to heart my emphasis on the importance of participation in airport-wide leadership teams and the

responsibility for integrating the law enforcement and homeland security functions with Airport Operations and other aviation staff. Gannon will continue to serve as Chief of Airport Police for the foreseeable future."

Patrick Gannon joined Airports as Chief of Airport Police in October 2012 after retiring from the LAPD following a 34 years of service, of which 12 years were at the executive management level.

The Club congratulates Chief Gannon on his new appointment.
