Los Angeles Federal Credit Union is looking for Board and committee volunteers.

Have you ever thought about volunteering as a member of LAFCU's Board of Directors or one of the committees? The Board has the ultimate responsibility for the direction and continued solvency of LAFCU and our committees review audits and loans. An important consideration and qualification for a position is the willingness to volunteer time to serve LAFCU and its members.

If you are interested in being considered for nomination to the board or appointment to a committee starting in 2015, and are an LAFCU member, send a résumé of your qualifications to our nominating committee (appointed by our Board Chairman) c/o LAFCU's President/CEO by Oct. 10. Individuals not nominated for a board position who wish to run by petition may call the office of LAFCU's President/CEO at (877) 695-2328, ext. 6309, and arrange to pick up a petition after Oct. 20. Each petitioner needs to secure 500 eligible signatures and the original completed petitions must be returned to a LAFCU branch by 5 p.m. on Nov. 24.

If a qualified petition is received by Nov. 24 to run against at least one incumbent, then ballots for the 2015 Board of Directors election will be mailed to eligible LAFCU members on Jan. 9, 2015. Each committee position is appointed by the Board of Directors.

The election results will be announced at the LAFCU Annual Meeting scheduled for 5:30 p.m. March 31, 2015, in the credit union's LA Mall Branch at 201 N. Los Angeles St. in downtown Los Angeles. Up for election in 2015 are Board office numbers #7, #8 and #9, each for three-year terms. The officials currently holding these offices and their current positions are: #7 – Denise McGee (Treasurer); #8 – Gary Mattingly (Director); and #9 – Chuck Rubin (Chairman).
